Item 2. Management's Discussion and Analysis of Financial Condition and Results of Operations

The Fund posted total assets of P189.29 million as of June 30, 2022 compared to P207.62 million reported as of December 31, 2021. It went down by 8.83% or P18.33 million. Significant changes in assets were registered in the following accounts:

- Cash and cash equivalents as of the end of June 2022 increased by P1.06 million or 8.56% to P13.45 million from the 2021 year end level of P12.39 million, attributed mainly from the collections of dividends on equities.
- Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVPTL) consists of listed equity securities and unit investment trust funds (UITF) held for trading. As June 30, 2022, equity securities amounted to P168.82 million, decreased by P4.59 million or 2.65% from P173.41 million as of December 31, 2021. On the other hand, UITF decreased by P0.21 million or 3.44%, to P5.65 million as of June 30, 2022 from P5.86 million as of December 31, 2021, due to fall in market values. Investment in listed equity securities and UITFs accounts represent 89.19% and 2.98%, respectively of the Fund's total assets as of June 30, 2022.
- Total receivables dropped 91.46% or P14.61 million from P15.97 million as of December 31, 2021 to P1.37 million in the second quarter of 2022 as receivables from broker counterparties were eventually collected.

Total liabilities decreased by 7.49% or P0.17 million from P2.18 million as of December 31, 2021 to P2.01 million as of June 30, 2022, as portion of the liabilities were paid off.

Less the liabilities, net assets attributable to shareholders amounted to P187.28 million which was P18.16 million or 8.84% lower than last year's audited balance of P205.44 million. Net asset value declined to P3.73 per share as of June 30, 2022 from P4.10 per share as of December 31, 2021.

For the six months ending June 30, 2022, the Fund registered a gross investment loss of P15.12 million; it went down by P13.17 million from the P1.95 million gross investment loss reported a year ago. The decrease was largely because of the following:

- Net trading loss from trading and investment securities totaled P19.55 million, a decrease of P13.95 million or 249.35% from the net loss of P5.60 million posted in the same period, last year, this is mainly due to the continued drop in the stock prices.
- Dividend income from equity investments was higher at P4.43 million, up by P0.79 million or 21.74% from P3.64 million in the same period last year.

Operating expenses totaled P3.04 million as of June 30, 2022, higher by18.65% or P0.48 million from 2.57 million last year, mainly attributed to higher operating expenses incurred during the period, particularly on commission and other transaction fees and advertising and publicity.

As a result of the foregoing, the Fund recorded a net loss of P18.17 million as of the second quarter, higher by P13.65 million from the P4.52 million net losses that was recorded previously

#### Key Performance Indicators:

 NAV growth – NAV growth of FFI should at least be in line with other similarly managed funds. Total net asset value of FFI decreased by 8.84%, from P205.44 million as of December 31, 2021 to P187.28 million as of June 30, 2022.

- Income (or Loss) per share income (or loss) per share is computed by dividing the Net Income by the weighted average number of common shares outstanding. As of June 30, 2022, the Fund performance resulted to net loss per share of P0.36 versus loss per share of P0.09 in the same period of 2021.
- Portfolio Quality The Funds' portfolio should, at all times, adhere to the investment parameters as indicated in the Funds' prospectus. The Fund invests in a mix of short-term investments and listed equities.
- Expense Ratio expense ratio is computed as Operating Expense divided by the Average Net Asset Value (NAV). For the period June 30, 2022, the Fund's expense ratio is 1.55% computed by dividing total operating expense amounting to P3.05 million by the average net asset value of P196.36 million.
- Market Price (MP) to NAV As of the end of second quarter of 2022 market price is P5.50 per share against NAV per share of P3.73 resulting to a premium of 47% per share versus end of 2021 of 59%.
